Information about Choirs and Directors

Sing for Your Life Choir has become part of the Friendship Village Wellness Program and the MacPhail Music for Life™ program. This community partnership was established in April 2009. In today's festival, the choir celebrates Stuart MacPhail, the founding member of Sing for Your Life!

Jeanie Brindley-Barnett received her Bachelor of Music Education and a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from Florida State University. She has studied at the London Opera Centre, performed with the San Francisco Opera Chorus, the Minnesota Opera Studio, has been a Roster artist with Young Audiences of Minnesota and the Minnesota and North Dakota State Arts Board programs. As a composer, she has had her works performed by the Minnesota Orchestra, Vocal Essence, St. Paul Civic Orchestra, Bel Canto Voices, Metropolitan Boy Choir, Angelica Cantanti, One Voice Mixed Chorus, Jacomo Chorale, Calliope, and others. Jeanie's most well-known work is *Butterfly Songs*, a musical setting of the poetry from the book *I Never Saw Another Butterfly*, poems by children of the Holocaust. Currently, Jeanie is a voice instructor at MacPhail, and serves as MacPhail's Coordinator of Adult Education Community Partnerships.

The Oak Grove Singers features students in grades 6-8 from band, choir, orchestra, and general music at Oak Grove Middle School. These students meet once a week after school and perform music in the community and other district schools. This year, the Oak Grove Singers were selected to work with the American Composers Forum on a new series called ChoralQuest, which offers new music for middle school choirs written by world class composers. This premiere performance of **Through All Things** by Stephen Paulus marks the official launch of this program. The American Composers Forum would like to thank the faculty and students of Oak Grove Middle School, the Katherine B. Andersen Fund of The St. Paul Foundation, Alfred and Ann Moore, and generous friends and contributors of the *ChoralQuest* program.

Bryan Blessing is in his 7th year of teaching music at Oak Grove Middle School. He recently completed his Master's degree in Music Education at the University of St. Thomas, and is a performer and music advisor in the professional choir, The Singers-Minnesota Choral Artists.

The **Dolce Singers** from Olson Middle School are an auditioned group of 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students who love to sing! The students meet once a week, on Wednesday mornings from 7:00-7:45 am. This choir rehearses less than the curricular choirs, but performs much more. In addition to regular school concerts in December and May, other performances include singing for special events at school like the 5th grade orientation and the awards program at the end of the year and performing an honors music concert with the jazz band and honors orchestra from Olson Middle School, as well as singing in the community.

Shelley Ohnsorg has been the vocal music director of Olson Middle School Choirs since 2004. Before that, she was the vocal director at Cathedral High School and John XXIII Middle School in St. Cloud. She received her Master's Degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota. At Olson Middle School, Shelley conducts 10 different choirs, teaches one class of general music, co-directs the school's annual musical, and prepares her students for many extra musical opportunities. Shelley is also actively involved in the music program at Mount Olivet

Valley View Voices is in its first year as a show choir at Valley View Middle School. This group is made up of 37 sixth-eight grade auditioned students. They rehearse after school two days a week and are directed by Chris Laumann and choreographed by Phidlynn Augustin (12), Zach Fremder (12), Zach Horn (12) and Lizzie Trudell (11), KHS Rhythm and Gold dance captains. This group will be performing at school pepfests, Valley View Elementary, an elementary school tour, VVM Spring Concert and at the RIG Annual. Our goal is to give students a choir/show choir experience before they move on to the high schools. This group will also offer students more performance opportunity throughout the school year.

Chris Laumann is in his eighth year of teaching at VVMS. He currently directs the 6th-8th grade choirs, Valley View Voices, as well as the yearly school musical, and teaches 8th grade general music. Along with his teaching responsibilities Chris directs three youth choirs at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis, and just finished his master's degree in Educational Leadership from Concordia University, St. Paul.

NOTE-able Singers began their musical journey in 1974 as an outreach of the Washburn Elementary School PTA. They have grown to become a show choir for women of all ages with an exciting repertoire that spans the decades from the 1920's to the present day. Audiences tap their toes to their music ranging from ragtime to rock, slow tunes to show tunes and many musical styles in between. They entertain throughout the Twin Cities area, bringing their show to banquets and parties, civic meetings, churches, shopping malls and senior residences.

Judy Nurkkala has been the director of NOTE-able Singers since 1994. She began to study piano in kindergarten and continued through her college years as a piano major. She also studied voice privately and has sung with the University of Minnesota Chorus, Finlandia University Choir, Evangelica Cantanti and various ensembles. Besides being a private piano teacher, she has also been an accompanist for soloists and choral groups and has been a church pianist, organist and choir director.

The **Bloomington Chorale** offers a unique opportunity for working adults and seniors to perform challenging vocal music of a variety of styles. For residents of Bloomington and surrounding communities, the Bloomington Chorale fills a need to provide quality choral entertainment that is affordable and in the neighborhood.

Steve Johnston has been the Bloomington Chorale's musical director since September 2003. Steve previously served as choral director and vocal instructor at the College of Lake County in Greyslake, Illinois and taught choral arranging and hymnology at Christian Life College, Mt. Prospect, Illinois. Steve earned his AA from Normandale Community College, his BA in Music from Bethel College in St. Paul, and his Masters from Trinity Divinity College in Illinois. Steve is pastor of Snake River Free Mission Church in Becker, directs Men of Praise, a Twin Cities-based men's chorus, gives private music lessons, and is a sales representative at Groth Music in Bloomington. During the summer Steve's ventriloquism and puppetry skills dazzle Kindercare preschoolers in the Twin Cities.

The younger choirs of **Angelica Cantanti**, Con Brio and Cantabile, grades 2 – 6, are preparatory groups. Their main purpose is to learn to sing beautifully and correctly, using the best of choral literature from a variety of cultures. Concert Choir, grades 6–

8, strives to take treble choral singing to the highest level. The singers work on choral and vocal techniques as well as note learning, ensemble singing, and communicating emotions through music. Cantanti Singers, grades 9 – 12, strives, though the study and performance of a wide variety of literature to perform choral music to the highest artistic standard. This includes works of many genres, cultures and styles.

Rita Docter has been an Angelica Cantanti director for 25 years. She graduated from St. Olaf College, taught music at Bakersfield High School in California, Sandburg Junior High in Robbinsdale, and Wayzata Elementary Schools. She directed children's choirs at Community of the Cross Lutheran Church in Bloomington. Rita is the writer of the BRAVO Music Appreciation Series for elementary age children. She has worked with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, the Minnesota Orchestra, the Cavani String Quartet from the Cleveland Institute of Music, and the American Suzuki Association.

Ann Schrooten joined Angelica Cantanti in 2006 as the director of Varsity Choir, now Cantabile. A native of southern Minnesota, Ann holds the B.M. degree in Vocal Music Performance from Saint Olaf College, and an M.M. degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota. Over the last twenty years, she has led choirs of all ages in large and small Lutheran parishes. At present, she works with the music and worship program and with the children and youth at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Minneapolis. Ann is a member of the Ensemble Singers of Vocal Essence, a professional Twin Cities Choir directed by Phillip Brunelle.

Nancy Grundahl has been the director of the Concert Choir since 1992. She is a conductor, composer, and soloist, and holds vocal performance degrees from St. Olaf College and the University of Minnesota. She is the conductor of the Riverside Singers Women's Choir of Augsburg College and the adult choir at Mayflower U.C.C. in Minneapolis. Over fifty of Nancy's arrangements and compositions for solo voice and choirs have been published and are sung around the country. She is active as an adjudicator, clinician, soloist, and guest conductor. Her exploration of vocal techniques for beautiful singing is a focus of her teaching and conducting.

Philip Brown joined the Angelica Cantanti staff in 2009. He graduated from Bethany College (Lindsborg, Kansas) and completed his master's in music degree from Northern Arizona University (Flagstaff, Arizona). He has taught high school music in Colorado and White Bear Lake. He is currently the Director of Choral Activities at Hopkins High School. His choirs have won many honors and been selected for feature performances at local, state and national conventions and festivals. Philip has also been active as a church musician and as an adjudicator/clinician for several music contests. He is the ACDA (American Choral Directors)-MN Repertoire and Standards Coordinator and ACDA-MN 9th-10th Honor Choir Co-Chair.
