1. Bachelor's Degree or equivalency in Music Therapy, Music Education or Music Performance experience. Students working toward certification and recent graduates are welcome to apply.
2. A desire to work with students with special needs. Experience preferred, but not required.
3. Ability to work with confidential information and exercise discretion.
