I have so many memories from Angelica that it is extremely difficult to pinpoint my favorite, so here are some favorites: performing at so many performance venues, singing at the Allina Health Gala with Cynthia Johnson, and being a part of the Cantanti Singers who got to sing at the 2023 MMEA Midwinter Clinic last February. I am also looking forward to singing at the 2024 ACDA Midwestern Conference next February in Omaha, NE. None of this would be possible without the incredible effort of all my conductors and collaborative/rehearsal pianists throughout the years. Thank you Ms. Schrooten, Ms. Lucius, Ms. Egger, Mr. Brown, Jeffrey, and Jamie for making my experience in Angelica incredibly unforgettable. You have been an indispensable part of my life growing into the person I am today.

This is my final Winter Concert with Angelica, and I cannot even begin to express my excitement for the broad range of repertoire every choir has to offer. I am so glad everyone is able to be here today, and I hope you all are able to enjoy the concert today. I hope this music "may bless you with love in your heart" in this holiday season.

ANGELICA CANTANTI CONDUCTORS



PHILIP BROWN is the conductor of the **Treble Singers** and the **Cantanti Singers** and is the Director of Choral Activities at Totino-Grace High School. He graduated summa cum laude from Bethany College (KS), majoring in K-12 music education and has is M.M. degree in music education from Northern Arizona University. His choral groups have been selected for performances at: CMEA Conference, CU-Boulder Madrigal Festival, MMEA Mid-Winter Conference, ACDA-MN Fall Conference, NC-ACDA Conference, MSU-Mankato Choral Festival, ACDA-MN Choral Arts Finale, St. Olaf College Choir Festival, Concordia College Choir Festival, Northern Voice Festival, and the Americana Portrait Festival with Mack Wilberg. Philip was honored as the 2011 ACDA-MN Young Director of the Year. He was selected as the Director of Note for Minnesota by Choral Director Magazine in 2012. In 2013 he received

the VocalEssence/ACDA-MN Creative Programming Award for his repertoire philosophy and programming. He conducted the Angelica Cantanti Youth Choirs – Treble Singers at the 2019 National ACDA and the Cantanti Singers under his conducting will be featured at the 2024 ACDA Midwestern Conference. In the spring of 2024, Philip will be the guest conductor of Singers in Accord, based in the Twin Cities. Philip is an active clinician and professionally affiliated with ACDA and NAfME. Recently he was named the ACDA Repertoire and Resource Chair for Senior High School choirs.



ANN WILLIAMS is the Conductor of the **Con Brio Choir**. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Music and Elementary Education from The College of St. Benedict, then earned her MA in Music Education at the University of St. Thomas. Ann is inspired by youth and loves teaching. For the past thirty-six years, she has been a classroom educator, music educator and youth choir director. Her directing experience includes the auditioned District 279 Children's Chorus, the St. Alphonsus Children's Choir, and is a founding director of the Twin Cities Youth Chorale (TCYC), an auditioned children's choirs in the northwest suburbs of Minneapolis. Over the years Ann's choirs have had the distinction of performing at both state and national conventions for the National Association for Music Education (NAfME

and MMEA) as well as the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA-MN) fall conference. Ann was also selected as an elementary honors choir co-director for ACDA-MN. Ann was a member of the Education Board for the Dale Warland Singers (DWS), and assisted with curriculum writing for both the DWS, and the Osseo Area Schools. She holds memberships in both ACDA and the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). As a vocalist, Ann currently serves as a cantor at the Basilica of St. Mary, Minneapolis.



MICHELLE GEHRZ is the conductor of **Cantabile** and also teaches Angelica's young elementary Prelude and Prep music classes. Michelle is a passionate and joyful choral conductor, church musician, organist, music educator, and collaborative accompanist in the Twin Cities. Michelle holds degrees in music education, sacred music, and organ performance from St. Olaf College, University of Notre Dame, and University of St. Thomas (ABT) and has her Orff Certification from UST. In addition to conducting with Angelica, she is Artistic Director of Bella Lumina – an adult treble choir based in Hopkins, and she directs the Senior Chorale (55+) with the Music Association of Minnetonka, MN. She is active as a collaborative accompanist for ACDA-MN and MN-MEA All-State Choirs and has

served as the R&R Chair for Children's/Youth Choirs for ACDA-MN. Michelle had the honor of conducting the ACDA-MN 4-5-6 Girls State Honor Choir in May 2023. Michelle's greatest calling and wish for her time on this earth is simply to be a "bringer together of singers. – I hope to be a catalyst for others to spread light, to find hope, and to feel immense joy through song!"



ELIZABETH EGGER is the conductor of **Concert Choir**. She also serves as the choir director at Scott Highlands Middle School in Apple Valley, MN. She earned her MA in Music Education at the University of St. Thomas and BM summa cum laude in Vocal Performance and Music Education at the University of Minnesota. A Wisconsin native with 18 years of experience, Elizabeth has held teaching and conducting positions in schools and churches across Minnesota and Wisconsin. Through these positions, her singers were selected to perform at the Minnesota Music Educators Association (MMEA) Midwinter Convention in 2014, and have been

featured as a clinic choir for the ACDA Fall Conference in 2015 and 2022. She is an active member and clinician with both the American Choral Directors Association of Minnesota (ACDA) and the Minnesota Music Educators Association (MMEA). Special directing features include: 2018 Super Bowl LII performance at US Bank Stadium and 2022 Children's Chorus Director for MN Orchestra season finale of Mahler's Symphony of a Thousand under the baton of Director Osmo Vänskä. Upcoming directing features include: Children's Choir Director for Minnesota Orchestra – 2023/24 New Year's Eve Celebration with Søndergård, Rachmaninoff and Tchaikovsky and the 7-8 SSA Honor Choir Conductor for ACDA of Minnesota in 2025.

This holiday season, Angelica is thrilled to have been invited to collaborate with Minnesota Orchestra musicians in two concerts. A small ensemble of ACYC singers will perform with trumpeter Charles Lazarus at his annual Merry & Bright concert on December 10. And middle-school ACYC singers will perform A New Year's Celebration, Sergei Prokofiev's *Winter Bonfire* and Tchaikovsky's *Nutcracker* on December 31 and January 1 with the orchestra and Music Director Thomas Søndergård.

The melody of the Shaker song "Simple Gifts" is incorporated into Matt Podd's arrangement of *In The Valley*, giving a fresh new take on this well-known song. *To Sit and Dream* takes us on a journey into the life and time of poet Langston Hughes, whose poem invites the reader to sit, dream, read, and learn about the world – and think about how dreaming can facilitate change. In *Flight*, the choir sings about how they are ready to fulfill their dreams. The Treble Singers conclude their set *Your Soul is Song*, with a message about the power of song and weathering the storms of life. —Philip Brown

CANTABILE (4:00pm concert)

Cantabile's songs reflect on self and community connection. How do we truly *Listen*? Perhaps it takes practice as you "listen to the sound of your breathing; listen to your voice as you're singing; listen to your heart as it's beating; listen as your soul awakes." Perhaps listening is a key to bringing *Peace on Earth, Goodwill to All*. Composer Andrew Parr arranged this song with a string quartet

specifically for Cantabile. During this time of extreme conflict in the world may our voices ring true in proclaiming "All the bells on earth will ring; their ringing voices bring a song of hope, a song of joy!" *Hands Are Knockin'* is a song that reaches beyond ourselves and beyond borders. "Alhamdulillah is a very common expression in Arabic and, like alleluia, used frequently to verbalize joy or gratitude in many situations. The juxtaposition of English and Arabic text throughout the piece is intended to reinforce the universality of the message—an invitation to all to open our minds, hearts and hands to each other." *Journey On* allows the singers to truly soar in their high treble voices as they sing, "We will rise, we will soar, we'll see all the places we've dreamed of before. We'll be free as the breeze, we'll write our own stories. We will journey on." Our closing song is *I'm On My Way*, based on a 1950's version by Mahalia Jackson with a newly added Afro-Cuban beat. It is a traditional spiritual that sings of home and the journey to freedom. —Michelle Gehrz

CONCERT CHOIR

Concert Choir is thrilled to present a diverse and inspiring program under the theme "Celebrate This Life!" Each piece has been carefully chosen to explore different aspects of life, from the fleeting nature of moments to the power of self-reflection and the celebration of our inner light. **Celebrate this Life** invites us to reflect on the beauty of the present moment. It poses the question: What if today was the best day of your life, but you missed it because you were busy worrying about tomorrow? **Blow**, **blow thou winter wind**, takes us on a poetic journey celebrating the season of winter. **Self Talk** is a world premiere written specifically for middle schoolers and explores the power of positive self- talk, encouraging the young singers to embrace their unique qualities and foster a healthy relationship with themselves. **Kira!** is a Malaysian counting song filled with movement and rhythm. The set concludes with **This Little Light of Mine**, a timeless and beloved spiritual, this piece celebrates the light within each of us. —Elizabeth Egger

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CANTANTI SINGERS

The Cantanti Singers begin with *Dawn to Dusk*, which captures the day's beginning and ending through a variety of vocal colors, percussion, and sounds. In the second half of *Komm, süsser Tod*, a short chorale by J. S. Bach, each singer represents their own connection to the song with an element of chance (known as aleatory music). *Ritual*, a "rhythmically-driving sonic narrative" by local composer Jake Runestad, alludes to social and cultural traditions that, despite continuing, may need further reflection. A soloist sings about an attempt at change, but ultimately is overtaken as the chorus and drums drown out any possibility of an alternative perspective. In *My heart be brave*, composer Marques Garrett states that "in the midst of discrimination, our heart - the core of our being - must lead us into rightful change. And as we continue doing right, the principles of honesty, love, and justice will give us the power to strive for what is due all of humanity." The Cantanti Singers conclude with the final movement in Aron Accurso's *You Are Enough: A Mental Health Suite*. The piece exemplifies its core message and serves as a powerful reminder that each of us is truly enough. –Philip Brown
