WELCOME

My name is Andie Schrader, and I am a senior at Thomas Jefferson High School in Bloomington. I have been singing in Angelica Cantanti for 12 years — and I can honestly say that I wouldn't trade those years for anything. I have always loved coming to rehearsals. In those early years I may not have been as focused as I am now, but choir has been my favorite weekly activity.



Singing in Angelica has changed my life forever. When I think back to those early years, I didn't realize how lucky I was to have Rita Docter as my director. We always had fun: whether it was her magic memory pills (which were just M&Ms) or her creative methods of teaching us music (like using a toy shark to demonstrate how to open our mouths wide). Each rehearsal seemed like an adventure!

Now I see what an honor it has been to learn from such caring conductors. I was in Cantabile with Ann Schrooten. She often played her guitar in rehearsals, and she taught me to love to sing. Nancy Grundahl was the conductor when I was in middle school in Concert Choir, and she taught me how to grow as a singer. One thing I remember and still think about today is how she explained phrasing to the choir, and taught us how to emphasize the most important words and phrases in songs. She cared about the music we were learning and she cared about us as singers. She was preparing all of us for the next step. High school conductor Philip Brown has been an encouraging and inspirational teacher. I sang in the Treble Singers for two years and loved every second of it. The last step in my Angelica journey is Cantanti Singers. I was nervous to audition for Mr. Brown, but then I remembered the things I love about Angelica, and how all of these people are like a family to me, and I wasn't nervous anymore.

I will always remember with joy every rehearsal, and every Snow Days retreat, every performance, and every shared moment with my friends in choir. It's hard for me to think this is my last Winter Concert performance. But I am so happy to be singing today in Angelica Cantanti — it's the best thing in the world.

Thank you for coming today and I hope you enjoy the concert!

ANGELICA CANTANTI CONDUCTORS



PHILIP BROWN is the conductor of the **Treble Singers, Tenor Bass Ensemble** and the **Cantanti Singers** and is currently the director of choral activities at Bloomington Jefferson High School. He graduated summa cum laude from Bethany College (KS), majoring in K-12 music education. He later received his M.M. degree in music education from Northern Arizona University. Before arriving in Minnesota, Philip started his public school teaching in the suburbs of Denver, Colorado (Arvada West High School). He has taught at North Campus High School in White Bear Lake and Hopkins High School. Philip was honored as the 2011 ACDA-MN Young Director of the Year. He was selected as the Director of Note for Minnesota by Choral Director Magazine in 2012. In 2013 he received the VocalEssence/ACDA-MN Creative Programming Award for his repertoire philosophy and programming.

Philip was named the Bethany College Gold Award recipient for 2015 and was the Winner of the Youth Choir Conducting Division for The American Prize 2016. Philip is an active clinician and professionally affiliated with ACDA and NAfME. He conducted the Angelica Treble Singers in February 2019 at the ACDA 60th Anniversary Jubilee National Conference in Kansas City, MO.



ELIZABETH EGGER is the conductor of **Concert Choir** and leads Angelica's NEW **Cambiata** group for men in grades 6 - 9. She also serves as the choir director at Scott Highlands Middle School in Apple Valley, MN, and as a ChoralQuest curriculum writer for the American Composer's Forum. She earned her MA in Music Education at the University of St. Thomas and BM summa cum laude in Vocal Performance and Music Education at the University of Minnesota. A Wisconsin native with 15 years of experience, Elizabeth has held teaching and conducting positions in schools and churches across Minnesota and Wisconsin. These include the Milwaukee Children's Choir, Minneapolis Youth Chorus, Plymouth Congregational Church, and various school districts in the Milwaukee and Twin Cities metro areas.

Through these positions, her singers were selected to perform at the Minnesota Music Educators Association (MMEA) Midwinter Convention in 2014, and have been featured as a clinic choir for the ACDA Fall Conference in 2015. As a vocalist, Elizabeth has sung professionally with The Singers - Minnesota Choral Artists, Milwaukee Choral Artists, Florentine Opera, and Skylight Music Theatre. She is an active member and clinician with both the American Choral Directors Association of Minnesota (ACDA) and the Minnesota Music Educators Association (MMEA).



RACHEL LUCIUS, director of **Cantabile**, also teaches K-5 general music in the Burnsville, Savage, Eagan school district, and has an extensive background in directing children and youth choirs. Rachel's choirs have shared the stage with musical artists including The American Boychoir, Sowah Mensah, Natalie McMaster, and David Benoit. She has worked on the artistic staff of The Northfield Youth Choirs, in Northfield, MN, Camp Albemarle, the summer music program of The American Boychoir School, in Princeton, NJ, and Allegro Choral Academy, in Apple Valley, MN. Rachel served as the guest director for the MN ACDA 4-5-6 Boys Honor Choir in May of 2019. A certified Orff-Schulwerk and Kodály music educator, Rachel holds a B.A. in Vocal Music Education from St. Olaf College, and an M.A. in Music Education from the University of St. Thomas.

Additionally, she has completed three levels of graduate choral conducting with Dr. Angela Broeker at UST. Other choral professional development work includes the Westminster Choir College Conducting Institute, and a ten-day independent study with Fernando Malvar-Ruiz and The American Boychoir as well as Melissa Keylock and the Princeton Girlchoir. Rachel and her family spent 5 months during the spring 2017 living in Finland where she studied children's choirs and music education on a Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching grant. While in Finland, she studied at the University of Jyväskylä and worked closely with both the Tapiola and Vox Aurea youth choirs. Rachel is currently working on her K-12 Administrative license through the Organizational Leadership, Policy, and Development program at the University of Minnesota. She expects to finish the program by December, 2020.



MICHELLE GEHRZ is the Conductor of **Con Spirito, Con Brio** and **Vivace Choirs**. She also teaches Angelica's Prep Choir Class, an introductory music hour for singers in Kindergarten – 2nd grade. She is currently on leave from teaching music in the Wayzata School District where she taught elementary music for 7 years. She co-directed and co-founded the Wayzata Elementary All-District Choir of 80 auditioned singers. Michelle is also Artistic Director for the adult treble choir – Bella Lumina – based in St. Louis Park. She taught vocal music at Mounds Park Academy in St. Paul and at St. Croix Preparatory Academy in Stillwater. Michelle's talents and passion for playing piano, organ, and directing have allowed her to serve many churches in the Twin Cities including the Cathedral of St. Paul, Mount Calvary Lutheran in Excelsior, Gethsemane Lutheran

in Hopkins, Lake of the Isles in Minneapolis, Minnetonka United Methodist, and most recently as Interim and Assistant Organist at Hennepin Avenue United Methodist Church in Minneapolis. Michelle received a Bachelor of Music degree in both Church Music/Organ Performance and Music Education. Her quest for further musical study took her to the University of Notre Dame where she received a Master of Music degree in Sacred Music/Organ Performance. Later she would complete all but her thesis for the Master of Arts degree in Music Education at the University of St. Thomas. Michelle will be the conductor of the Minnesota ACDA 4-5-6 Girls' State Honor Choir in May 2020 and is currently serving as ACDC-MN Repertoire and Resource Chair for Children and Community Youth Choirs.
